#### **Summary Text:**

On September 4, 2019, Monterey Bay Community Power's (MBCP) Policy Board of Directors voted to accept the County of Santa Barbara as a new member agency. To reflect its expanded territory, MBCP has changed its name to Central Coast Community Energy (3CE). 3CE will launch community choice energy (CCE) service for Santa Barbara County customers in 2021. It is 3CE's practice to provide an annual member update presentation (Attachment A) to each of its member jurisdictions. 3CE will provide an update on its response to COVID-19, energy procurement, energy programs, customer enrollment and customer service offerings.

#### **Background:**

#### How Does CCE Work?

CCE enables local governments to leverage the purchasing power of their residents, businesses, and governments to purchase or generate electricity for their communities and set some customer rates. CCE programs are typically created to provide a higher percentage of renewable or carbon-free electricity and provide a new funding source for local energy initiatives, such as energy efficiency programs and electric vehicle incentives. The existing investor-owned utility (IOU)—in Santa Barbara County, PG&E and SCE—continues to deliver the electricity purchased by the CCE provider and bill customers. The process is relatively seamless to customers and those who do not want to participate in a CCE program may opt-out and stay with the incumbent IOU.

#### CCE Related Action

On August 13, 2019, the Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 5086, authorizing the implementation of a CCE program within the County's jurisdiction through participation in MBCP's CCE program. Subsequently, on September 4, 2019, MBCP's Policy Board of Directors voted to accept the County of Santa Barbara and the cities of Carpinteria, Goleta, Guadalupe, Solvang and Santa Maria as new members. Buellton City Council has also voted to join 3CE. 3CE currently has 32 member jurisdictions.

To reflect its expanded territory, MBCP has changed its name effective September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and is now Central Coast Community Energy (3CE). 3CE will launch services for customers in Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) territory in January 2021. 3CE will launch services for customers in Southern California Edison Territory (SCE) in October 2021 due to a conflict with SCE's Customers Service Re-Service Platform (CSRP) project.

#### 3CE Annual Member Agency Update

It is 3CE's practice to provide an annual update presentation (Attachment A) to each of its member jurisdictions. 3CE will provide an update on its response to COVID-19, energy procurement, energy programs, customer enrollment and customer service offerings.
