It is my opinion a full EIR is necessary to appropriately reflect full impacts of proposed important infrastructure plan.

While not an attorney or CEQA expert, CEQA Section 15064 a(1) states; "If there is substantial evidence, in light of the whole record before a lead agency, that a project may have a significant effect on the environment, the agency shall prepare a draft EIR." Further CEQA Section 21,100 (b)(2)(B) states; "Any significant effect on the environment that would be irreversible if the project is implemented."

Planning and Development Public records reveal a proposal document, Finalized April 5, 2019 and titled; Conceptual Drawings and Environmental Review for the Orcutt Community Plan Amendment Project. Review of this document clearly reflects intentions to conduct an EIR under CEQA guidelines, Section 15123 for this same UVP GPA Amendment. While referenced UVP Neg. Dec. objective is to remedy traffic congestion and provide secondary access for Elks Rodeo Event Center, new school Ag. Class room and potential freeway frontage commercial facilities, this environmental review misses the elephant in the room, being GROWTH INDUCING expansion into valuable regional agriculture, open space land East of the U.S. Hwy 101 interchange.

Page 71 says this: "Although the proposed project would eliminate one of several obstacles to development East of the study area, the proposed project is just one step away in a series of requirements that must first be realized for potential future development to commence."
