


Cumulative Cases

Includes Lompoc Federal Correctional Complex (FCC)








7-Day Rolling Sum of New Cases by Area

Not including Lompoc Federal Correctional Complex






COVID Hospitalized and ICU





Santa Barbara County 7-day Average Adjusted* Case Rate per 100,000 Community Residents





Santa Barbara County 7-day Average Community Test Positivity Percent



As of 11/15, CDPH changed the Case Rate and Testing Positivity metrics to reflect a 4-day lag instead of a 7-day lag. HPI data was not released the weeks with 4-day lag data. As of 11/28 data, the State reverted back to the 7-day lag.





Vaccine Update



COVID-19 Vaccines

- ➤ Anticipated delivery of 3,900 Pfizer doses is on its way
 - 2 boxes directly to Cottage Hospital; 2 boxes to Marian Regional Medical Centers
- ➤ Anticipated delivery of 6,600 Moderna doses as early as next week
 - Allocations to hospitals and other high priority medical workers

- Small Business Hiring Tax Credit, a \$1,000 tax credit for each new employee hired by small businesses (up to \$100,000 per business)
- Interest-free deferral of sales/use tax up to \$50,000 for businesses with less than \$5 million in taxable sales
- California Rebuilding Fund small business loans
- Small Business Disaster Relief Loan Guarantee Program and Small Business Loan Guarantee Program via IBank







Workforce Special Projects for Job Seekers

 Over 500 positions in various workforce programs available for youth and adult job seekers with an a emphasis on COVID-19 laid off workers.

Services include:

- Immediate employment opportunities
- Occupational skills training opportunities
- Financial assistance for workforce participants. Up to \$800 in supportive services to pay for rent, utility bills, or technology (computers, tablets, Wi-Fi hotpots) necessary to telework.

Services available through other Workforce Partners

- Partnership with community colleges to offer training and employment services.
- Special workforce initiative with Lompoc Adult School and Career Center to start February 2021 aimed at training and putting workers back to work.
- Other workforce programs available through Transitioning Mental Health and Vision y Compromiso.
