- Coastal Commission Certification of Montecito and County Land Use and Development Code
 - Coastal Commission hearing tentatively scheduled for April, 2010
 - Suggested modifications would be analyzed for Board consideration within six months of CCC action



- Simplify process and permits for agricultural projects
 - Work in progress for several years delayed by other agricultural policy initiatives (Uniform Rules, 661 rezone)
 - PC scheduled to hear on February 17, 2010
 - BOS expected in April 2010



- Improve inter-departmental staff coordination on project review
 - Initial presentations made in 2009 by PW (Flood Control, Water Agency, Transportation, Surveyor), EHS, Fire
 - Additional meetings planned for 2010 to improve coordination and communication, encourage upfront analysis



- Integration of Accela into other departments' development review process
- Consult with Subdivision/Development Review Committee on potential improvements and opportunities
