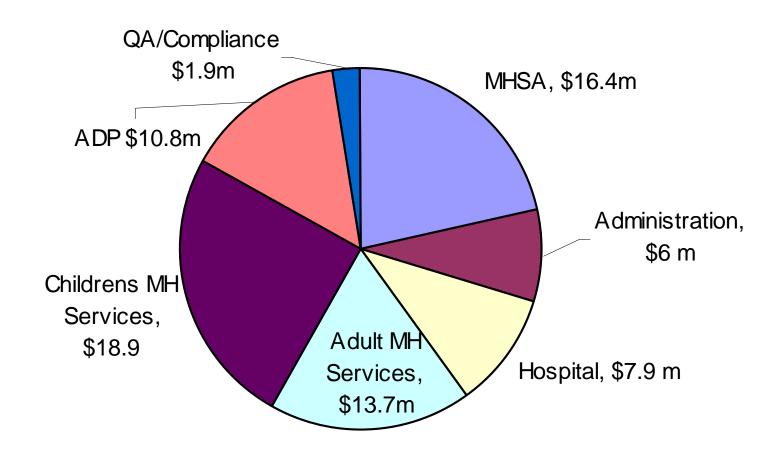

Mental Health Mandates

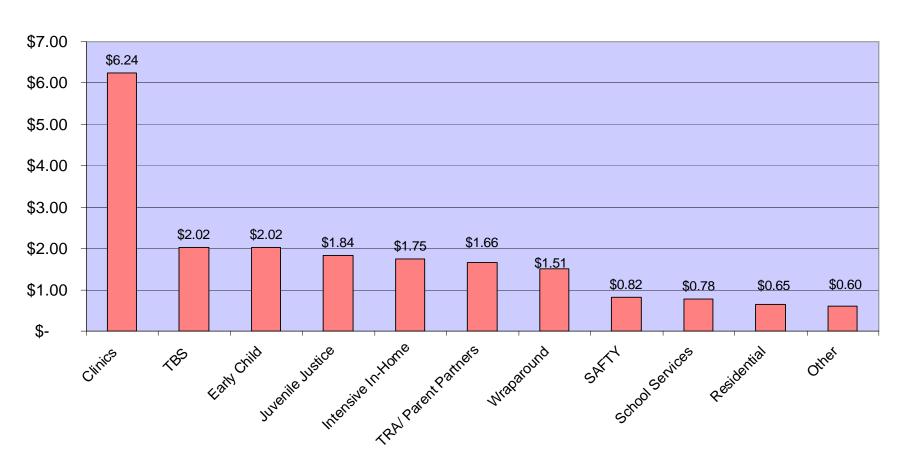
- Mental Health Services (Title 9 WIC) to:
 - Medi-Cal beneficiaries with mental health needs
 - Children with serious emotional disturbance (SED) to the extent resources allow
 - Adults and older adults with severe mental illness (SMI) to the extent resources allow
 - Special education students
- Crisis Assessment
- Inpatient mental health treatment

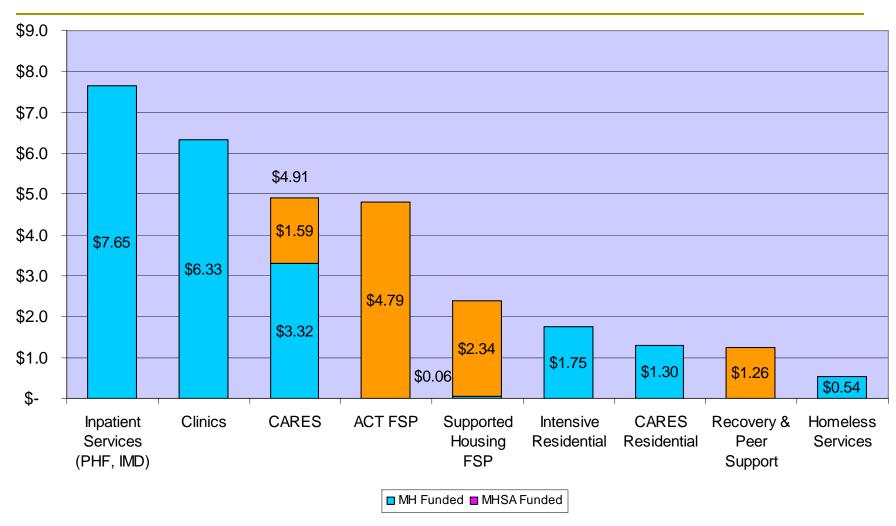


Adult Mental Health System

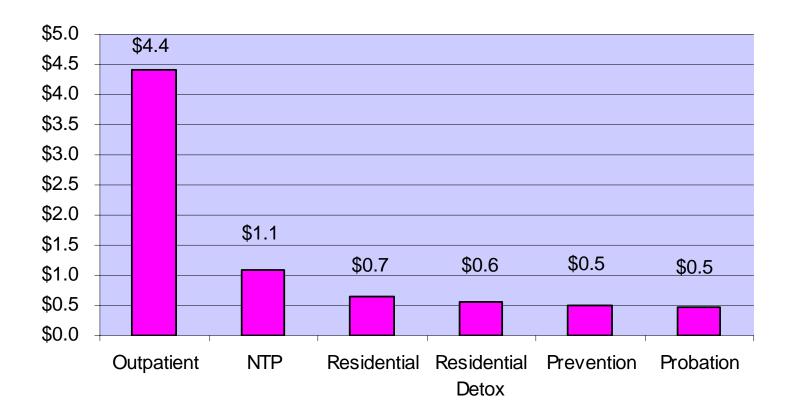


ADP Services

Challenges

- Growing proportion of clients without insurance
- Increasing community demand for CARES evaluation, emergency services and acute inpatient care
- Loss of realignment dollars and risk of decline in MHSA dollars
- Elimination of \$1.5 million in SACPA funding
- Governor's FY 10-11 January Budget proposes potential funding reductions:
 - Diverts MHSA funds to cover other existing MH services
 - Reduces or eliminates CalWORKS and Offender Treatment Programs
 - Reduces SGF for Mental Health
