#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve, ratify and authorize the Chair to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) for the implementation of data collection and mapping of noxious and invasive weed population for the period of January 15, 2021 through June 30, 2022 in the amount of \$24,753.25; and
- b) Determine that the above action involves government funding mechanisms and/or fiscal activities and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4).

### **Summary Text:**

This item is on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors to review and execute an agreement with the CDFA so as to receive reimbursement for the cost of activities associated with the Noxious Weed Grant Program, including implementation of data collection and mapping of noxious and invasive weed population as defined in the Food and Agriculture Code Section 7270-7276.

#### **Background:**

The grant supports efforts by the County Agricultural Commissioner's Office (CAC) and the Santa Barbara County Weed Management Area (SBCWMA) to survey and map noxious and invasive weeds located along public roads in Santa Barbara County. CAC will also develop a treatment strategy and the information will be shared with other SBWMA partners including County Public Works Department, Los Padres National Forest, and Cal Trans. Efforts are focused on Purple Star Thistle (*Centaurea calcitraps*) and Artichoke Thistle (*Cynara cardunculus*) because both weed species are a pest of rangeland areas and populations are known to exist along public roads in the County.
