Recommended Actions:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors for the County of Santa Barbara:

- a) Set a hearing for the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Recommended Budget for the County of Santa Barbara to begin Tuesday, June 8, 2021, and continue, if necessary, through Friday, June 18, 2021, with specific hearings scheduled for Tuesday, June 8 and, if necessary, Thursday, June 10, 2021; and
- b) Determine pursuant to CEQA Guidelines §15378 that the above fiscal activities are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act.

It also is recommended that the Board of Supervisors for the County of Santa Barbara acting as Successor Agency to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency:

- c) Set a hearing for the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Recommended Budget for the County of Santa Barbara as Successor Agency to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency to begin Tuesday, June 8, 2021, and continue, if necessary, through Friday, June 18, 2021, with specific hearings scheduled for Tuesday, June 8 and, if necessary, Thursday, June 10, 2021; and
- d) Determine pursuant to CEQA Guidelines §15378 that the above fiscal activities are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act.

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Summary Text:

Budget hearings for the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Recommended Budget for Santa Barbara County, and the Recommended Budget for Santa Barbara County as Successor Agency to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency, are scheduled for June 8 and 10, 2021, and, if necessary, may be continued into the week of June 14-18, 2021.

Background:

Budget hearings are scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 8, 2021. The County Executive Office will begin with a presentation highlighting the major issues and funding allocations in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Recommended Budget and any significant changes made since the April Budget Workshops. Board discussions, deliberation, and adoption of the budget are scheduled for Tuesday, June 8 and, if necessary, Thursday, June 10, 2021.

The recommended budgets for the County of Santa Barbara and the County of Santa Barbara as Successor Agency to the former County of Santa Barbara Redevelopment Agency will be posted on the County's website at <http://www.countyofsb.org/default.aspx> by Friday, May 21, 2021, and will be available in hard copy for public review beginning on May 21, 2021, at the First Floor lobby of the County Administration Building (105 East Anapamu Street, Santa Barbara, CA) between 8:00 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays, or, if the County Administration Building is fully reopened to the public, at the Clerk of the Board office (105 East Anapamu Street, Room 407, Santa Barbara, California) between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. A copy will also be available at the County's Fifth District office at 511 East Lakeside Parkway, Santa Maria. Budget hearings and availability of the Recommended Budget will be noticed (Attachment A) no later than Friday, May 21, 2021, in the Santa Barbara News-Press, Lompoc Record, Santa Ynez Valley News, and the Santa Maria Times.

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Based on guidance from the California Department of Public Health and the California Governor's Stay at Home Executive Order N-33-20 issued on March 19, 2020 to protect the health and well-being of all Californians and to establish consistency across the state in order to slow the spread of COVID-19, the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors meetings are not currently providing in-person participation.

The agenda for the June 8 hearings will be posted online on June 3. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the webinar.

Ongoing Contracts

In order to efficiently manage the Board's agenda, a list of ongoing contracts by department will be presented at budget hearings with a recommendation that the Board approve, as a group, their renewal for FY 2021-22. This process only applies to single-year contracts and does not apply to multi-year agreements. To qualify for this process:

1. all contract terms and conditions, including contract scope of work, must remain unchanged from the prior contract, and
2. the value of the contract cannot change by more than 10% from the prior year.

Ongoing contracts in amounts that exceed a change of 10% must be individually presented to the Board for approval. If rates or units of service change, the contract may qualify for the ongoing contracts process if these changes are clearly disclosed on the ongoing contracts list.

Budget Inquiry Forms

Members of the Board of Supervisors may have questions that the County Executive Office (CEO) can answer prior to the budget hearing. A Board Inquiry Form (Attachment B) has been included with this letter to facilitate such inquiries between now and the budget hearing on June 8, 2021. Completed forms may be submitted through email. This form enables documentation of questions and answers, facilitating the ability of others who may have similar questions to be aware of the answers, which provides the Board with consistent information during their budget deliberations.
