#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Authorize the Chair to terminate, effective May 14, 2021, the **LAGS Spine and Sportscare Medical Centers, Inc.** ("LAGS") Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor for fiscal years ("FY") 2018-2021 (BC Number 19-149), originally executed by the County on November 6, 2018 and subsequently amended on August 18, 2020, and the **LAGS** Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor for FY 2021-2024 (BC Number 20-282), originally executed by the County on May 4, 2021, (collectively, the "Agreements") due to LAGS' cessation of business operations related to the provision of Drug-Medi-Cal services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries on May 14, 2021 and its consequent material breach of the Agreements;
- B. Direct the Director of the Department of Behavioral Wellness or designee to issue a letter, substantially similar to the draft provided in Attachment A, terminating the Agreements, effective May 14, 2021;

- C. Delegate to the Director of the Department of Behavioral Wellness or designee the authority to take actions necessary to provide for the winddown of the Agreements, subject to the Board's ability to rescind this delegated authority at any time;
- D. Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities or funding mechanisms, which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA Guidelines.

### **Summary Text:**

The Santa Barbara County Department of Behavioral Wellness ("BeWell") provides a continuum of mental health and substance use disorder services to Santa Barbara County residents, in part, through contracted providers including Community-Based Organizations ("CBOs"). LAGS ceased business operations on May 14, 2021. The above-referenced Agreements are on the agenda to authorize the Chair to terminate the Agreements, direct the BeWell Director or designee to issue a termination letter substantially in the form of Attachment A, and delegate authority to the BeWell Director or designee to take all other necessary steps to winddown the Agreements.

## **Background:**

The Board of Supervisors authorized the Director of BeWell to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement (No. 18-95148) on behalf of the County with the State Department of Health Care Services ("DHCS") to deliver SUD services under DMC-ODS on October 16, 2018 for FY 18-21. On November 6, 2018, the County entered into an Agreement with LAGS for the provision of Alcohol Drug Program Substance Use Disorder services under the DHCS DMC-ODS pilot program, effective December 1, 2018 to June 30, 2021.

The First Amended Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor for FY 18-21 with LAGS was executed by the County on August 18, 2020.

The Board approved of the renewal of the contract with LAGS for FY 21-24. The Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor for FY 21-24 was executed by the County on May 4, 2021, with a start date of July 1, 2021.

BeWell received notice from LAGS on May 12, 2021 that it would cease all operations related to the provision of Drug-Medi-Cal services to Medi-Cal beneficiaries, effective the close of business on May 14, 2021. In subsequently ceasing its operations as described, LAGS is in default in the performance of its Agreements with the County and thus materially in breach of one or more of the Agreements' provisions.

Under DMC-ODS, LAGS operated an adult outpatient treatment program in Santa Maria, which provided Level 1.0 Outpatient Services, Level 2.1 Intensive Outpatient Services, Naltrexone, and additional MAT services to assist clients with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health issues to obtain and maintain sobriety. Treatment services included best practice individual and group counseling, drug testing, and Co-Occurring Capable treatment services. MAT is the use of prescription medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a whole-person approach to the treatment of substance

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use disorders. LAGS provided necessary Outpatient Services, Intensive Outpatient Services, Naltrexone, and Additional MAT to BeWell clients.

#### **Performance Outcomes:**

At the time of the closure, there were 42 clients receiving outpatient services and 15 clients receiving recovery services. BeWell, with the support of the LAGS Clinic staff, worked to promptly transition currently open clients to other Drug-Medi-Cal providers to ensure continuity of care for these clients. All clients have been linked to BeWell Alcohol Drug Program care coordinators who have either made contact with each client or have made efforts to contact them and are waiting to hear back. Seventeen clients have been referred to other contracted treatment providers, including MAT providers. Some of the clients have decided to stay with LAGS and pay for treatment on their own. It is also expected that some of the clients in recovery services might be successfully completed and referred to outside self-help groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous because recovery services are aftercare that may not be indicated any further.
