

#### PART IV – PROGRAM NARRATIVE (Suggested Format)

**PROJECT:** Mid-field security enhancements, (fencing), apron reconstruction, and erosion control grading.

# AIRPORT: Santa Ynez (IZA)

## 1. Objective:

The objective is to perform earthwork, grading, and erosion control along the north down-slope of the mid-field airport area, to install airport perimeter fence, and to reconstruct an existing airport operations area.

### 2. Benefits Anticipated:

Address the unconstrained north earth down-slope that has historically created erosion control issues along the lower airport access road & potential instability with the aircraft operations area due to close proximity. This segment of the airport perimeter fence will prohibit access from the road, up the slope & direct into the active airfield operations area. Through reconstruction of this operations area with pcc surface course, this area, frequently occupied by rotor-craft, will provide a more durable, safe (FOD-free) apron, allowing greater separation from fixed wi

## **3. Approach:** (See approved Scope of Work in Final Application)

The project was bid in the spring, 2021. Construction will proceed immediately upon receipt of a federal grant. It is anticipated that all construction will be complete and the grant closed by the end of May, 2022.

## 4. Geographic Location:

The Santa Ynez Airport is located along the south side of Highway 246, east of the community of Santa Ynez, central Santa Barbara County. The airport is owned by the County of Santa Barbara and managed by the local Santa Ynez Valley Airport Authority.

#### 5. If Applicable, Provide Additional Information:

The segments of this project (erosion control grading, security fencing, and apron reconstruction) all work together due to very close proximity: fencing passes through the erosion control grading area, apron is at the top of the slope and will provide surface drainage control away from the slope, fence will eliminate un-authorized vehicle access.
