


# Hospital Capacity, 10/4






#### % Staffed Adult ICU Beds in Use

Does not include ICU Surge. Red Zone < 20% available






# **COVID-19 Hospitalization Data**






#### Overview

- March 14, 2020 September 23, 2021: 5,893 COVID-19 cases among 0-18 age group




# 0-18 Year Olds by Episode Date






# 0-18 Year Olds by Gender






# 0-18 Year Olds by Race/Ethnicity

#### Summary

- >0-18 year old cases by episode date followed similar trends to the pandemic, with a peak of cases in the winter months.
- The summer peak of 2021 was higher than the summer peak of 2020 among 0-18 year olds
- ➤ The majority of 0-18 year cases were Hispanic/Latino, however, most children in Santa Barbara County are Hispanic/Latino
- ➤ Most 0-18 year old cases resided in Santa Maria followed by Santa Barbara and Lompoc










#### SBC Health Officer Order 2021-10.5

#### SBC Health Officer Order 2021-10.5

- >SBC HOO for indoors masking renewed until November 5, 2021
- >SBC HOO will be lifted when case rate is less than 6/100,000 for 2 weeks
  - However: masks would still be required in certain settings per State HOO or Cal-OSHA:
    - Schools
    - Healthcare
    - Congregate living
- >Triggers that may cause re-issuance:
  - High case rate
  - Circulating variants
  - Hospital capacity

#### U.S. Treasury Emergency Rental Assistance (ERAP)

- American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 \$21.55 billion in emergency rental assistance ("ERA 2")
- II. 2021 Consolidated Appropriations Act \$25 billion in emergency rental assistance ("ERA 1")

For each ERA 1 and ERA 2 allocation round, SBCo received an allocation from U.S. Treasury and the State.

#### **Guidelines**

- ✓ Qualifying renter households 80% or less Area Median Income, priority 50% Area Median Income
- ✓ Qualifies for unemployment OR has reduction in income, incurred costs, or financial hardship due to OR DURING COVID-19
- ✓ Demonstrates risk of homelessness or 'housing instability', such as past due rent, utility notices, eviction notices, etc.



#### **ERA Assistance**

- All arrears dating back to March 2020
  - Current
  - Up to 3-months prospective
  - Can reapply for 3-months of current or prospective rent
  - ❖ Maximum of 15 months ERA1 assistance, 18 months combined ERA1 and ERA2.
- Utility arrears and current
- ❖ Payments will be made directly to landlords for any arrears for back-rent before any current or future rent.
- Payments for utility arrearages to utility providers.
- ❖ Relocation Assistance i.e. security deposits and first/last months rent for new move-ins.

#### **Application Status**

As required by AB 832, United Way of Santa Barbara County and State HCD are both staffing call centers where applicants (tenants, landlords, or Courts at their option) can check the status of an application.

❖ Tenants or landlords that need to confirm the status of an application to the <u>State HCD</u> should call (833) 430-2122.
