- c) Authorize the Director of Social Services or designee to adjust the Line Item Budget of the Child Abuse Listening Mediation Agreement without exceeding the total contract amount;
- d) Authorize the Director of Social Services or designee to adjust the Line Item Budget of the Family Service Agency of Santa Barbara County dba Santa Maria Valley Youth and Family Center in North County Agreement without exceeding the total contract amount; and
- e) Determine that the activity is not a "Project" subject to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review per CEQA Guideline Section 15378(b)(5), since the activity is an organizational or administrative activity of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.
