The Santa Barbara County Workforce Development Board will use surplus of program year 2018-2019 funding (one-time funding) of \$57,480.00 from United States Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Adult and Youth Formula funds; and

d) Determine that the above recommended actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that the above recommended actions are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.
