Title: Consider recommendations regarding the Third Amendment to the Agreement for Reimbursement of the Cost of a Bikeway across the Gaviota Terminal Company Property, Third District, as follows:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute the Third Amendment to the Agreement between the County of Santa Barbara and Texaco Trading and Transportation, Inc. for and on behalf of Gaviota Terminal Company for Reimbursement of the Cost of a Bikeway ("Third Amendment") to extend the term of the Agreement for two additional years until July 1, 2017; and
b) Determine that the Board's approval and execution of the Third Amendment is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b)(3), because of the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and there is no possibility that the approval of the Third Amendment may have a significant effect on the environment and direct staff to file the attached draft Notice of Exemption.
