Title: Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a Lease Agreement between the County of Santa Barbara and the Orcutt Babe Ruth League, Inc. for the use of a portion of County owned property known as Waller County Park in the Santa Maria area for the purpose of operating a youth baseball facility. The term of this lease is for a period of approximately 5 years from the date of approval by the Board of Supervisors until December 31, 2011. In lieu of monetary compensation, Orcutt Babe Ruth League, Inc. will maintain the infields and concession stand, and manage the ongoing youth baseball activities. Government Code §25536 allows counties by 4/5 vote of the Board of Supervisors to lease certain county owned property for such purposes, Fourth District. (4/5 vote required)
