a) Receive and file a report on Emergency Permit 15EMP-00000-00012, which authorized removal and relocation of large boulders and debris deposited without permits within Toro Canyon Creek to reduce flood risk and other associated damages;

b) Determine that issuance of the emergency permit is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15269(c), as this action was necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency; and

c) Determine that receiving and filing the report is not a project pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(5), as it is an administrative government activity that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.
