- k) Adopt a Resolution establishing an appropriation limit for FY 2007-08 for the Santa Barbara County North County Lighting District;
- l) Adopt a Resolution establishing an appropriation limit for FY 2007-08 for the Santa Barbara County Flood Control and Water Conservation Districts.
- m) Select the change in the California Per Capita Personal Income as the price factor in determining the fiscal year 2007-08 limit for Santa Barbara County and the special districts, and ratify selections by recorded vote;

n) Select the change in population within Santa Barbara County and all contiguous counties as the population factor in determining the fiscal year 2007-08 limit for Santa Barbara County, and the change in population within Santa Barbara County for the special districts and ratify selections by recorded vote.
