Title: Consider recommendations regarding adopting and rescinding Parking Zones, Second and Third

Districts, as follows:

a) Adopt a Resolution to establish a "no stopping, standing or parking" zone on San Antonio Road in the Goleta area and a "no stopping, standing or parking" zone on Burton Mesa Boulevard (north) in the Vandenberg Village area;

b) Adopt a Resolution to rescind Resolution 69-262 thereby removing a "no parking" zone on San Antonio Road in the Goleta area; and

c) Find that the proposed actions are for the operation and maintenance of an existing public facility, involving negligible, or no expansion of use beyond that which presently exists, that the proposed action is therefore exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to 14 CCR 15301, and approve the filing of a Notice of Exemption on that basis.
