a) Receive and file a report on Emergency Permit No. 17EMP-00000-00002, which authorized the removal and replacement of a failed drainage culvert and the associated grading required to stabilize a failed slope and driveway at 883 Toro Canyon Road;

b) Determine that issuance of the emergency permit is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant CEQA Guidelines section 15269(c), as this action was necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency; and
