	iii) Repair, remodeling, or other repetitive work eligible for job order contracting in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 20128.5 for which funding has been approved pursuant to a Budget Revision Request;					
	g) Authorize the Director of General Services, or their designee, to increase the Maximum contract value up to \$4,949,291.00 in order to facilitate only those projects for which the Board has appropriated funding; and					
	h) Find that the proposed actions are administrative or other fiscal activities that do not involve commitment to any specific project, and therefore not a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to 14 CCR 15378(b) (4), (b)(5).
